**Request made under the Official Information Act 1982**

Thank you for your email of 25 February 2019 requesting the following information under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act):

- 1) *How much money has been spent maintaining, repairing and improving State Highways in the North Island since 2008? Please provide a yearly breakdown.*
- 2) *Please provide a State Highway breakdown of question 1.*
- 3) *How much money has been spent maintaining, repairing and improving State Highways in the South Island since 2008? Please provide a yearly breakdown.*
- 4) *Please provide a State Highway breakdown of question 3.*
- 5) *Please provide a regional breakdown of the figures requested in questions 1 and 3. Please provide a yearly breakdown.*

The answers to questions 1, 3 and 5 are publicly available and can be found under on the NZ Transport Agency's website here: <https://www.nzta.govt.nz/planning-and-investment/learning-and-resources/transport-data/data-and-tools/>.

I have attached a summary of the information broken down by Island as an attachment for your convenience.

Questions 2 and 4 cannot be answered as the costs are not broken down by individual state highway. Therefore, I am declining question 2 and 4 of your request under section 18(f) of the Act that the information requested cannot be made available without substantial collation or research.
