

- Why not keep CoPTTM?
- 2. TTM process roles and responsibilities are unclear
- 3. Focus is on large contractors
- Language is inconsistent and terminology is not accurate
- 5. Support material is missing practice notes, diagrams, risk assessment frameworks, forms
- 6. Risk is subjective and people are not trained to complete risk assessments
- 7. Minimum standards are missing which could result in inconsistencies across the country

NZGTTM 10 key changes – in progress

- 1. Introduction inclusion of further act references LGA (S353), Railways Act, CDEM Act, FENZ Act, Policing Act, Utilities Access Act
- 2. Enhanced reference to Keeping healthy and safe while working on road or roadside GPG (name change from RRSWHS GPG)
- 3. Diagram to outline TTM operational workflow
- 4. Table of geometric design information in toolbox
- 5. Equipment specification removed from Toolbox and included in M23 Appendix F (new appendix)
- 6. Assurance and T&C sections updating aligning with current industry work
- 7. Inclusion of an example Risk Assessment Framework
- 8. Inclusion of design prompt guides (diagrams and text)
- 9. Inclusion of practice note template
- 10. Inclusion of new TMP forms and Onsite Record form.

NZGTTM – topics that won't change

- 1. Legislation and strategy guiding the NZGTTM. We must deliver to requirements of legislation.
- 2. TTM workflow roles and responsibilities. Designed to enable organisations to meet their legislative responsibilities.
- Material such as CoPTTM sections C to H will not be included. Contractors are responsible for onsite practice and must take responsibility for this.
- 4. NZGTTM will not contain procurement advice. Waka Kotahi will include in is contract procedures/proforma manuals for Waka Kotahi contracts.
- 5. Transition Plan Waka Kotahi is developing its plan for its contracts. Other clients and RCA's to determine their plans to ensure they meet their legislative obligations.
