

Update on the NZGTTM


The purpose of the guide – more focus on TTM planning, less on TTM operation.



Focus is on better planning upfront

- Temporary Traffic Management Planner (TTMP)
- Engineer/designer
- Corridor manager
- Traffic Management Manager

wider industry.




Transition approach

From COPTTM to NZGTTM: it's not a switch on – switch off approach.



- CoPTTM will continue to be available and will 'co-exist' with the NZGTTM as the industry transitions to the new best practice risk-based approach.
 - CoPTTM is written into many contracts in New Zealand Waka Kotahi and other clients.
 - Therefore, must maintain available until this is no longer common practice.
- Waka Kotahi will proactively apply the new guidance to its work sites via contracts with key suppliers.
- Anticipate CoPTTM will retire approx. 2025.

High level transition timeline – initial steps








