Safer speeds for your roads

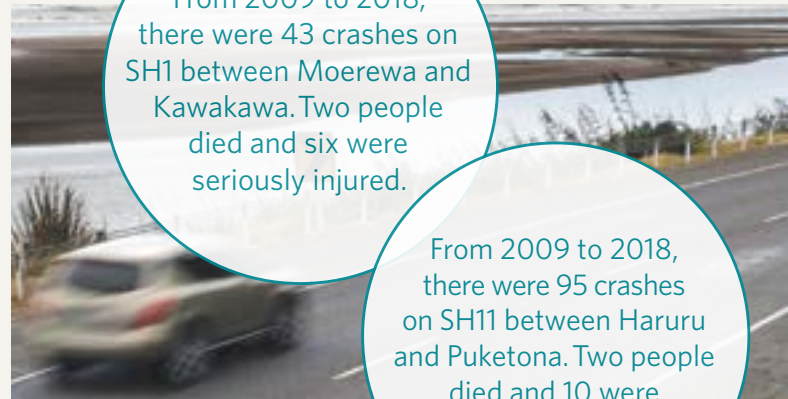
We want to make your roads safer for everyone who uses them. Shoulders have been widened and safety barriers have been installed along State Highway 11 (SH11), but there is something more we can do to prevent people from dying or being seriously injured – reduce speed limits so they are safe and right for the road.

What we've heard

You've told us speed limits on the stretches of road on SH1 between Moerewa and Kawakawa, and on SH11 between Haruru and Puketona feel too high to be safe.



From 2009 to 2018, there were 43 crashes on SH1 between Moerewa and Kawakawa. Two people died and six were seriously injured.

From 2009 to 2018, there were 95 crashes on SH11 between Haruru and Puketona. Two people died and 10 were seriously injured.

What we know

SH1 Moerewa to Kawakawa

- There are three bridges on this stretch of road that make 100km/h feel unsafe. Some drivers find them tricky to navigate.

SH11 Haruru to Puketona

- The area of Haruru is growing. It's getting harder to turn in and out of the township.
- There are more people cycling, both on the road and on the shared path.

What we're proposing

Based on what we know, we think the following would be safer speeds on these roads:

SH1 between Moerewa and Kawakawa

- Reducing the speed to 80km/h for the 100km section from Kawakawa, over the three bridges to just before Moerewa.
- Reducing the speed to 50km/h for the 70km section from Mac's Prime Meats through to Leaiti Street in Moerewa.

SH11 between Haruru and Puketona

- Reducing the speed to 80km/h over the 100km section from Puketona to Haruru Falls.
- Reducing the speed to 60km/h for the 70km section through Haruru Falls.

We want to know what you think.

After all, locals know their roads. We want to hear what you think about these proposed limits, as well as the current speed limits, and whether you believe some stretches are more dangerous than others.

We'll use your feedback to recommend what speed limits are best for these roads and then formally consult with you.

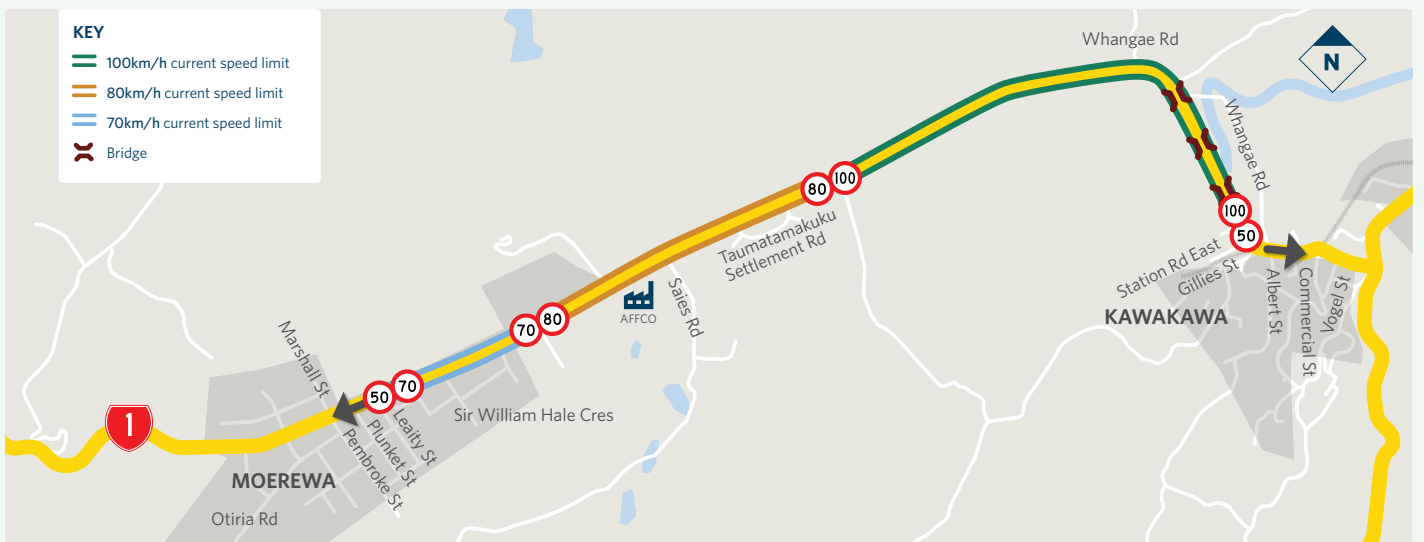

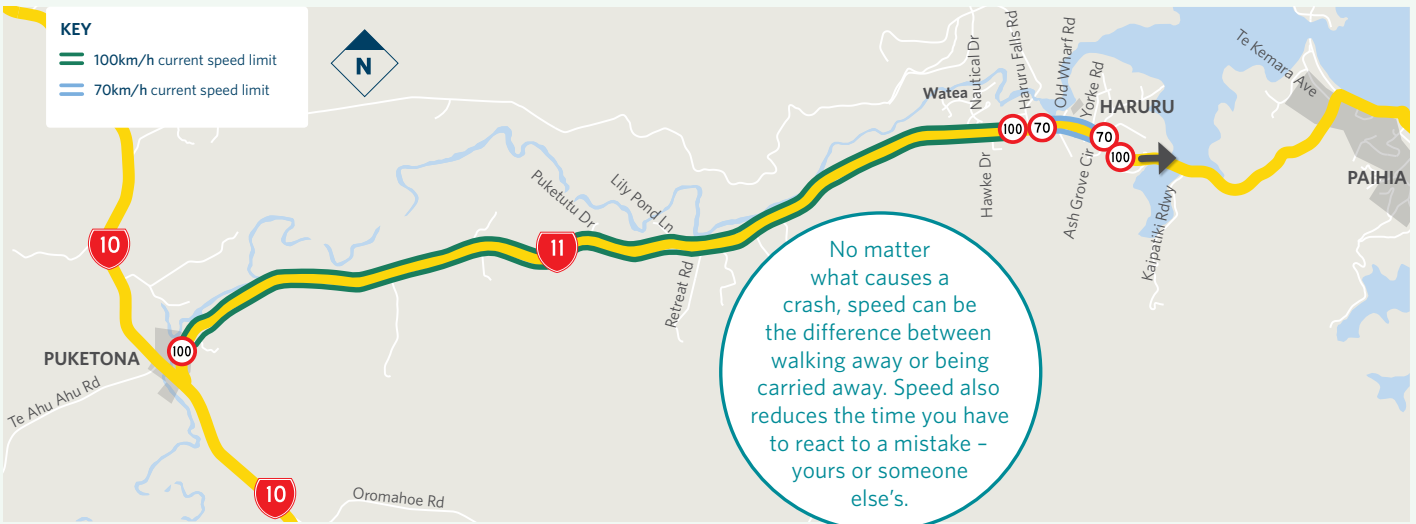
