If you want to change the name on your driver licence, or if the name on your identity documents isn't the same as the name on your licence, you'll need to provide acceptable evidence of name change. Go to www.nzta.govt.nz/identification for more information.

Where to apply

Take your completed form and all **original** documents to any driver licensing agent. To find an agent in your area go to www.nzta.govt.nz/agent

The agent will process your application, check your identification, and may take your photograph and a sample signature for your licence. They'll also check your eyesight and book an appointment for any driving tests.

You must pay the fee when you apply.

Eyesight

You must prove that your eyesight is up to standard. You can:

- pass an eyesight screening check at a driver licensing agent, or
- present a satisfactory eyesight certificate or medical certificate (no more than 60 days old).

The certificate must be issued by a New Zealand registered optometrist or health practitioner (see page 6). If you don't pass the eyesight check at an agent, you'll need to provide a certificate instead.

If you have sight in only one eye, or have only one eye (monocular vision) you'll need to present an eyesight certificate.

Practical test

Useful information to help you prepare for and pass the practical tests is available in *Learning to drive: Getting your car licence* (Factsheet 45) and in *The official New Zealand road code*.

The testing officer may attach a small video camera to the front windscreen at the start of your test. The camera records the test and enables the testing officer's performance to be audited. It also assists in investigating complaints where the test result is disputed. If you don't want your test recorded, please tell the testing officer.

Changing or cancelling

If you need to change or cancel your test, you can do this online at www.nzta.govt.nz/online, or visit your driver licensing agent as soon as possible.

There are no fees to change or cancel your test.

Warning

It's an offence to supply false or misleading information and may lead to court action. The consequences can include losing your licence and/or paying a fine. If you don't supply all relevant information, your application may be delayed or declined.

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Privacy information

The information requested is required for NZTA (and its agents) to process an application for a V, I or O endorsement and to maintain the Driver Licence Register. Collection of this information is required by the Land Transport (Driver Licensing) Rule 1999 and Part 4A, Subpart 2 of the Land Transport Act 1998. Some of the particulars you provide will become part of the Driver Licence Register. Collection, dissemination and release of this information is authorised by the Land Transport Act 1998 and part 7 of the Privacy Act 2020.

Your photo may be captured for the purpose of printing it onto your driver licence card. Your photo may also be used by the Department of Internal Affairs, Department of Corrections, Ministry of Justice, Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (Immigration), New Zealand Customs Service, and the New Zealand Police for the purposes of identity verification and law enforcement under section 200 of the Land Transport Act 1998, or for one of the purposes outlined in part 7 of the Privacy Act 2020. Your photo may therefore be disclosed to one of these agencies, for one of these purposes.

NZTA (and its agents) will hold, store, use or disclose any personal information collected on this form in accordance with the Privacy Act 2020. The information you provide will be used to process your application and administer your endorsement (if your application is successful). NZTA (and its agents) may also use some of these particulars to provide you with information relating to driver licensing and driving, or to contact you for feedback on our services.

Under the Electoral Act 1993, s 263B, the Electoral Enrolment Centre operates an authorised information matching programme with NZTA. The purpose of this programme is to assist in keeping the Electoral Roll up-to-date.

To keep the Driver Licence Register up-to-date NZTA also operates an authorised information matching programme with Births, Deaths and Marriages. Please refer to the Privacy section of our website for more information.

What happens next

Your application will be sent to NZTA to be processed, and for the police vetting check to be performed.

Application for a new endorsement

Appointment

- You must present either your current photo driver licence or your current temporary driver licence with photo
 ID (eg Kiwi Access or 18+ card, student ID card, current or expired passport) to the person conducting the
 practical driving test.
- If you normally wear glasses or contact lenses to drive, make sure you bring them with you to the test.
- You need to provide the vehicle to be used for the test. It must:
 - be a class 1 vehicle (see www.nzta.govt.nz/what-you-can-drive for the definition of a class 1 vehicle)
 - be clean and tidy, safe and have a current vehicle licence displayed
 - have a current certificate of fitness (CoF) or warrant of fitness (WoF) displayed and meet CoF or WoF standards
 - have a current road user charges (RUC) licence displayed if applicable.
- You must not be late for the appointment time shown or you won't be able to sit the test.
